PHASE 2 BEGINS THIS SUMMER!

After planning, praying, voting to move ahead, giving faithfully, and receiving many helpful suggestions for improvement to Phase 2, we begin construction in August! Yes! To God be the glory! As we begin to demo walls and move bricks, we are calling one another to observe these core Phase 2 principles:

The period of waiting is over, and we are now preparing to move. We are relocating our library books as that room and part of the hallway become storage for chairs, tech booth, and stage panels. We are moving items out of the gym storage and locker rooms so that in August, a temporary construction wall can be built south of the MPR and over to the west entrance to allow for creating the new restrooms. This section will take about 8-10 weeks, and there will be a lot of "moving parts". We will need lots of patience and grace toward each other. In fact, our love and patience toward each other will draw people to know and love Jesus. (Jn 13:5). It's time to loosen the tent pegs so we can move forward together!

3. To work hard together.

Don't you love Nehemiah? When it became clear that it was time for the project to move forward, it moved well and quickly because "the people had a mind to work." (Neh. 4:6) Some of our best memories from this era will be the work we do side by side, and conversations we have in the parking lot in the evenings when the work is accomplished. Throughout the whole project, your time and talent are needed, whether swinging a sledgehammer, sweeping, baking, organizing, painting, installing, or something else,

whenever you're available. We'll share our hearts and invest our blood, sweat and tears – don't miss out.

4. To honor God in our giving.

There are still dollars to raise; we are counting on God to deliver dollars and on each other to give. PHASE 2 FAQ

At last month's Body Life Update, the Master Plan Team presented answers to frequently asked questions. The first three are addressed below:

Q1: Will we have enough storage?

A1: Just like at your home where you collect things, we're going through decades of stored items, sorting and deciding what to keep, donate, toss or even offer for sale. Once Phase 2 is complete, we'll have about 1,100 sf of storage on the main level, not much different than the original 1,200 sf.

Q2: What about an elevator?

A2: Never fear, we'll have the best, maybe biggest, elevator in the City of Sheboygan! We're going from a chair lift (1 wheelchair plus 1 companion) to an elevator rated for 33 people (who really like each other)! It means we'll be able to move table racks and chair racks from the lower level to the main level quickly and easily.

Q3: Aren't we losing restrooms?

A3: While it's true we're going from 2 sets of 3 stalls to one set of 5 stalls for women (men have less), we're also adding an adult restroom in the secure Kids Ministry wing PLUS a family-style restroom near the Kids Min check-in PLUS a family-style restroom in the Commons area near the church office.

BUDGET CHALLENGE FROM THE TREASURER

The FY 2023 budget is much like past budgets, molded by Biblical principles, challenged, and prayed over. We continue our long-standing commitment to people – our pastors and staff, our missionaries, and programs that reach those who don't yet know Jesus Christ as Savior. This means everything in the FY2023 budget is measured against our mission of multiplying committed followers of Jesus Christ.

While we are being conservative, we are facing a number of unknowns particularly in two expense areas: inflation, which we've tried to budget for; and the Master Plan, which will impact the budget if we need to borrow since loan payments will come from the annual budget.

We are blessed to have leaders with vision, and the Master Plan is a vision given and timed by God. There are people in this church who were given a vision 30 years ago, and we praise God for their obedience! I know that funding this current vision will be a challenge. I don't want us to have to borrow for it. I believe we have the means to pay for it if we ALL follow God's guidance. Amongst us, He has provided enough.

Our greatest enemy when it comes to giving is our prosperity. It is an American way of thinking to believe, like the rich man in Matt. 19:16-22, that our prosperity is a result of our righteous life and conduct. Jesus tells us in Matt. 6:33 not to be anxious about what we need, but to seek first His kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things will be added.

Is our first thought with any of our God-given resources (time, talent, treasure) "how can I use this for the kingdom of God?" Let's come together and make this place light up a dark world with the love of Jesus!

BAPTISM CLASS

This class is an overview of what the Bible teaches about Baptism. New believers and those ready to testify publicly of their faith in Jesus Christ should attend this class. 
Thank you, church!
