

MASTER PLAN - A SEASON OF THANKFULNESS

As we begin Phase 2 construction of the Master Plan, the stories of God's faithfulness and guidance have been profound and unmistakable. Here are a few examples:

- A generous and unanticipated gift (several years ago) made it possible to raze the former "Quasius Construction" building and pave a necessary "West Parking Lot." This lot has been an immediate blessing to our church and the neighborhood, as our friends at Lakeshore Community Health use the lot every weekday. That property is now owned without a mortgage, free and clear. You have probably heard the story of God sending rain on the West Parking Lot just when it was needed.
- A vote of 84% of the congregation and sacrificial giving in support of this project, to the tune of \$1.2M+ has made it both possible and necessary to move forward. The construction start date will be made public very soon!
- Homes on the south side of Cambridge Avenue were purchased several years ago at a bit of a premium. Three of the homes needed to be razed, but by God's grace, the others are now worth substantially more than we paid for them and provide either a very wise beginning of an additional contiguous tract of land or a very wise investment for later recoupment of dollars. Only God could have orchestrated this!
- We need additional meeting space during construction. Our Deacon Chairman, Dean Becker noticed a Community Room at Lakeshore Community Health (see the first bullet point above for more about this friendship). When we inquired about using the room, they were more than willing to help us! Several groups will use the William Weissert Community Room during construction. The room is special needs-accessible, on the first floor, has a kitchen available, and, by God's grace, has been offered to us (a fellow non-profit) free of charge. In fact, LCH in-house groups who usually use the room are willing to be displaced so that we can have priority. As God would have it, the administrator of LCH with whom we are communicating attended church here in her youth and has gracious and fond memories of her time here, and faith in Jesus Christ. Praise the Lord!
- In a time when construction costs are skyrocketing, God has allowed that "self-performed" work, and a generous \$25,000 donation (of plumbing fixtures) from the Kohler Company has kept our estimates nearly unchanged since February. With complete approval from Elders, Deacons and on the recommendation of the Master Plan team, the final "Green Light" for this project was ceremoniously given on August 11, 2022.

Please enter a season of thankfulness to God for the great things he has done!






