Grounded In the Goodness of God

"All my life You have been faithful All my life You have been so, so good With every breath that I am able, I will sing of the goodness of God."

As I look back on my story with Jesus, I'm often reminded of pivotal people in my life who have, through the teaching of the word, imprinted rich Biblical truths on my heart. In the fourth grade I had a very special Sunday school teacher who was well -respected in our church, but honestly, I was slightly intimidated by him. Entering his classroom after summer break, I found a seat near the front of the class. Dr. Harkema came in with no real greeting or introduction and said "Children, we are all doomed. We deserve the penalty of death and eternal hell." Pause. I sat frozen in my seat. I didn't look around to see my peers' faces. I just looked at him. "Doomed? Death and hell?" Then he spoke again and asked "Have any of you ever lied? Disobeyed your parents? Held anger and hate in your heart?" I did a quick inventory and realized I was guilty of all of the above. He then said "Well then, it's death and hell for you!"

I think I may have actually gasped because he then looked at me and said "Heidi, on your own merit and goodness you simply aren't good enough. Let me tell you about the One who is." He spoke of a good God who, by His grace, love and mercy, sent Jesus to cover my condemnation—my earned and very deserved condemnation.

In that classroom that day, I asked Jesus to cover me; to enter my life with His goodness. I remember thinking, "If God never saw fit to bless me with any other goodness in my life, the gift he had already given in Jesus was enough for me to be convinced of His goodness."

Fast forward. 2022 has been riddled with heartache and loss. We suffered deep betrayal by some of our dearest friends and were then rejected by many because of this betrayal. We lost our home and everything in it to fire. My parents suffered sickness and hospital stays. Our precious foster grandson was reunited with his bio parents after 3 years in our care and no expectation of losing him. Recently we dropped off our youngest daughter at college and became emptynesters without a nest.

But intermingled with all this loss we saw God move mightily. Two of our foster grandchildren were adopted into our family and a miracle granddaughter was born after years of infertility. We saw kindness and generosity beyond comprehension after our house fire: people opening their hearts and resources to help keep us on solid ground; a beautiful

home offered to us for as long as we need, smack dab in the middle of the woods, perfectly central to work and school. We have seen God's goodness all around us. Our salvation is secure.

The Lord is my salvation. When we equate God's goodness to ease and comfort, we lose this beautiful opportunity to know Christ in his suffering, to cling to Him for dear life because he is the only sure and good thing; to rest in the nearness of God: to open our hands and say. "It's all Yours, God;" to know beyond a shadow of a doubt that the greatest thing we have in all of life is Jesus Christ. The laying down of His life for me is the only proof I need of His goodness. When life doesn't feel good, God still IS good. When life leaves us with more questions than answers, we cling to our covenant keeper.
