Key Passage:

John 1:29-43

Workshop Exercise:

1. Ask God to help you become better at Gospel conversations following a Biblical pattern and His Spirit to guide you.
2. What were you seeking when you came to Jesus? How can you use this in your testimony?
3. Think of some recent conversation with an unbeliever. How well did you listen to their heart? What on ramp to the Gospel could you have used?
4. In a recent Gospel conversation, did you know when to take the exit ramp?
5. Identify some people in your relationships that you can pray for opportunities to have Gospel conversations.

**Gospel Conversations and Full Spectrum Discipleship**

When Jesus gave the Great Commission to His disciples, He did not say “Go therefore and evangelize all nations”, but rather “Go therefore and make disciples of all nations” (Matthew 28:19). Through His wise use of words, Jesus is stating that while discipleship begins with evangelism, it does not end with the conversion of the unbeliever. Rather it continues on with the equipping of the new believer, until they begin to disciple others.

The below modification of the Engel Scale can assist us as we navigate Gospel conversations with unbelievers as we seek appropriate on ramps, lane changes, and off ramps in conversations.
